Sermon Title: A City on a Hill

Sermon Series: The Sermon on the Mount: Living as Citizens in the Kingdom of Heaven

Read: Matthew 5:13-16

Discuss: Matthew 5:1-12 is known as the Beatitudes. Some Biblical scholars call Matthew 5:13-16 the Similitudes. These verses illustrate in a very practical way who it is that Jesus has called His disciples to be. Thinking back over the principles taught the past two weeks, and over the examples that you have seen over the course of your life, who are some Christians who have been salt and light in your life? What made them salt and light to you?

Read: John 8:12

Discuss: Jesus is the Light of the world and He calls us the light of the world. What are some things we can do in order to shine more brightly?
